## 6th Heroin Distributor Sentenced to Prison

Madison, Wis. - Stephen P. Sinnott, United States Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin, announced that Walter "Bobby" Green, 29, Middleton, Wis., was sentenced today by U.S. District Judge Barbara B. Crabb to 11 years and 3 months in prison for distributing heroin. Green pleaded guilty to this charge on November 4, 2009.

Green, a member of a Chicago street gang, was arrested on August 11, 2009, at his apartment in Middleton, following his indictment by a federal grand jury alleging that he distributed heroin on three occasions and possessed heroin with intent to distribute on one occasion.

Judge Crabb stated that Green deserved a lengthy prison term because he was a core member of a heroin conspiracy that distributed multiple kilograms of heroin in the Western District of Wisconsin over a substantial period of time.

Green is the sixth of nine defendants to be sentenced in federal court after a series of arrests in August related to heroin trafficking. Cherish Jones is scheduled to be sentenced tomorrow for her role in the case. Chavis Webster and Yarnell Fuller are scheduled to be sentenced in early February 2010.

The five other individuals were previously sentenced were:

The charges against Green were the result of an investigation conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration; Wisconsin Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Investigation; Madison Police Department; Middleton Police Department; Sun Prairie Police Department; McFarland Police Department; DeForest Police Department; and Dane County Narcotics and Gang Task Force. The prosecution of the case has been handled by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jeffrey M. Anderson and Paul W. Connell.
