

## SASP Direct Services Funded Project Summaries

### **Family Services of NE Wisconsin, Inc.: \$47,000**

Funds will be used by Family Services Sexual Assault Center to provide direct services and outreach to primary and secondary victims of sexual assault with the majority of the focus on the Hispanic and Southeast Asian populations of Brown County.

### **Reach Counseling Services: \$41,300**

The project is a joint effort between Reach Counseling Services and UW-Oshkosh. The campus advocate also works closely with the University Counseling Center to provide comprehensive services to victims. As part of the collaboration, Reach Counseling provides one full-time victim advocate who is housed on campus at the University Counseling Center. The advocate provides medical, legal, personal and systems advocacy to students and faculty, support groups for students and awareness education to students and staff.

### **Hmong American Women's Association: \$23,439.47**

Project Ntuj Tshiab will provide linguistic and culturally specific services to Hmong victims and/or those who have been impacted by Sexual Assault in Milwaukee County through advocacy, intervention, support, education and referral services

### **Canopy Center, Inc.: \$47,190**

Funds will be used by the Canopy Center to: provide short-term crisis counseling and drop-in group for non-offending parents/caregivers in between the time of the forensic interview and successful placement in appropriate longer-term community services; provide group or individual therapy for non-offending parents/caregivers who also are survivors of child sexual abuse and need services for their own victimization to be able to then focus on their child and group/individual/dyad/family services to collaterally affected individuals.

### **The Healing Center: \$17,500**

This project will support a volunteer coordinator who will work to increase the number of underserved adult survivors of sexual abuse and assault in Milwaukee who have access to 24/7 culturally competent, community-based advocacy. Activities will focus on enhancing telephone and in-person advocacy, including advocate accompaniment and support for survivors during forensic exams, police interviews, and court appearances.

### **Wise Women Gathering Place: \$9,730**

As a newly recognized SASP, Wise Women Gathering Place will upgrade its phone system to include individual voicemails and purchase ALICE data software installation and training.

### **Women and Children's Horizons, Inc.: \$31,581**

Funds will be used by Women and Children's Horizons (WCH) to provide support for sexual assault program revitalization, direct client services, and community outreach in Kenosha County. The project will improve access to sexual assault services with the addition of a part-time advocate and foster the development of programming based on community-identified needs.
