UPDATE: Officer Involved Shooting in Town of Grand Chute, Wis.

GRAND CHUTE, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) is investigating an officer involved shooting in the Town of Grand Chute, Wis. that occurred on the evening of Friday, April 12, 2024.

At approximately 5:56 p.m., deputies with the Outagamie County Sheriff's Office responded to a vehicle crash in the 2800 block of W. Prospect Avenue in the Town of Grand Chute. When they arrived, deputies observed William Jae Kil Nelson, 22, with a knife. Outagamie County Sheriff's Deputy Noah Yeck, 1.5 years law enforcement service, attempted to use a taser on Nelson without success. Outagamie County Sheriff's Sergeant Ellis Brooks, 10 years law enforcement service, discharged his firearm, striking Nelson. Life saving measures were performed. Nelson was transported to a local hospital and has since succumb to his injuries.

No law enforcement officers, or other individuals were injured during the incident.

Outagamie County Sheriff's Sergeant Ellis Brooks remains on administrative leave, per agency policy.

The involved deputies were wearing body cameras during the incident.

DCI is leading this investigation and are assisted by the Wisconsin State Patrol, Grand Chute Police Department, Appleton Police Department, a DCI Crime Response Specialist, and members of the DCI Digital Evidence Unit. All involved law enforcement are fully cooperating with DCI during this investigation.
