

SYNOPSIS REPORT FOR OFFICER-INVOLVED DEATH OF JESSE C. SHUPING

On Thursday, December 7, 2017 at approximately 4:20 a.m., the Wisconsin Department of Justice - Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) received a request from the Marinette County Sheriff's Office (MRSO) to respond to the scene of an officer-involved shooting death located at State Highway (STH) 64 and Schacht Road in the Town of Peshtigo, Marinette County, Wisconsin. The officer-involved critical incident involved MRSO Deputies David Oginski and Spencer Elias and Marinette Police Department (MBPD) Police Officers (PO) Gregory Haemker and Derrick Maye.

DCI S/A Special Agent (S/A) Jeffrey Wisch was assigned as the lead case investigator and DCI S/A Bradley Kust was assigned as the secondary case investigator.

On 12/7/2017, MBPD personnel were investigating an incident at the Budget Inn Hotel, located in the City of Marinette, regarding a subject armed with a gun who threatened and pointed the gun at two occupants in a hotel room doorway. MBPD investigated this incident and developed a possible suspect. The suspect was only known as "J" or "Jesse," and was described as a white male, approximately late 30's to early 40's, 6'0" tall, wearing a camouflage jacket. A photo was obtained from the hotel security camera further describing this suspect. After investigating this incident, an address in Marinette County was identified to check for the suspect. Law enforcement officers from both the MRSO and MBPD responded to the said address to attempt to locate the suspect. Upon law enforcement arrival at this location a subject who matched the description of the suspect from the hotel incident was observed outside of that residence in the driveway, standing near a vehicle which was running with its headlights on. MRSO and MBPD members attempted to talk to the suspect. The suspect ignored MRSO and MBPD dialogue, and fled westbound in the vehicle on STH 64. MRSO and MBPD squads pursued the suspect, with emergency lights and sirens activated. The suspect lost control of the vehicle attempting a turn southbound onto Schacht Road from STH 64 and entered the ditch near the southeast corner of the intersection.

The suspect's vehicle was pinned in the ditch by Deputy Oginski, using his law enforcement squad, preventing the suspect from driving out of the ditch. The suspect exited the driver's side door of the vehicle and turned towards Deputy Oginski and PO Haemker while the suspect was armed with a handgun in his right hand. This suspect raised the gun, and pointed the gun at both Deputy Oginski and PO Haemker firing one round in the direction of Deputy Oginski and PO Haemker. Deputy Oginski and PO Haemker both fired their duty handguns at the suspect striking him. Deputy Elias and PO Maye were also on scene. Deputy Elias fired his duty patrol rifle at the suspect as Deputy Elias stood near the suspect's passenger door located on Schacht Road. PO Maye fired his duty handgun at the suspect while PO Maye stood on STH 64 near the southeast corner.

The suspect received numerous gunshot wound injuries from these four law enforcement officers. After the suspect was secured by law enforcement officers, he was provided medical treatment

on-scene but died from his injuries and pronounced deceased. This suspect was later positively identified as Jesse Cole Shuping.

DCI documented the scene with the assistance of the Wisconsin State Patrol, Technical Reconstruction Unit.

Shuping's biological mother and father were identified and a death notification was made to them by Virginia law enforcement on 12/7/2017. A Wisconsin Crime Victim Services form was provided to the mother and father both via email and U.S. Mail to their residence in Virginia.

DCI agents interviewed MRSO Deputies Oginski and Elias, along with MBPD Officers Maye and Haemker, on 12/11/2017. DCI special agents also interviewed two witness law enforcement officers who were on scene and did not fire their weapons, two emergency medical workers, and five neighbors of this incident scene during the neighborhood canvass.

DCI collected six law enforcement dash camera video recordings, from MRSO and MBPD squads. Three of these video recordings depicted various elements of the incident. DCI examined all of the video recordings related to the critical incident which involved Shuping.

DCI collected all items of evidence. Evidence that was seized during the investigation included: the deceased body, three duty pistols, a patrol rifle, .40 cal. fired cartridge casings, .45 cal. fired cartridge casings, .223 cal. fired cartridge casings, an unfired bullet, video recordings, an automobile, cellular telephone, clothing articles, personal effects, biological specimens, DNA evidence and other miscellaneous articles of evidence.

An autopsy of Shuping was conducted at the Fond du Lac County Medical Examiner's Office, in Fond du Lac, WI, on 12/8/2017 by Chief Medical Examiner Dr. Doug Kelley, MD. The autopsy revealed Shuping died as a result of internal organ injuries from gunshot wounds sustained during an engagement with law enforcement.

On 1/2/2018, the completed DCI investigative file, as of that date, was submitted to Marinette County District Attorney (DA) DeShea D. Morrow for her legal review
